

#### A Note from the Superintendent

Dear Ceramics.

Every year the first quarter of the school year seems to fly by and this vear is no different. Now that the second quarter of the 2019-2020 school year is underway, we have established expectations and routines and are in the middle of teaching and learning. By visiting our classrooms and seeing our students and teachers highly engaged in educational activities, it is clear we are offering a quality education to our students. Some of these great activities and events are highlighted in this newsletter. This includes updates from each of our schools, an athletic department update, information about district upgrades, and many others.

Over the summer, we started an Energy Conservation Project to make many upgrades to the school. Some parts of the project are ongoing but some have already been completed. These upgrades include repaying the parking lot, upgrading both the interior and exterior lighting to LED, new HVAC controls, new chillers at the high school, new boilers at the K8, and window wraps on the entrance to the high school. All of these upgrades were needed to ensure our students have a safe and comfortable learning environment as well as to extend the useful life of our buildings. Even though our buildings are over thirty years old, they remain in great shape. First time visitors to our district often express their amazement that our buildings look as good as they do given their age. A big reason behind that is our preventative and continued maintenance to our buildings and

grounds. Thank you to our custodial and maintenance staff for all of your hard work.

We have continued to upgrade our academic programming over the summer as well. This includes replacing our outdated iPads for all high school students as we continue our one device to one student initiative throughout the district. We also added an additional full time and a part time social worker to help address the mental health needs of our students. Finally, we added a Creation Station for our elementary students so that they can experience some of the same opportunities available to our middle and high school students in our Maker Space. Also, I would be remiss if I did not congratulate our Varsity Boys Golf team on their outstanding season and trip back to the State Tournament. Our Girls Golf team also had an excellent season and finished first in the MVL. Congratulations to both teams!

We also continue to offer free breakfast and lunch to all students. Study after study has shown that it is extremely difficult for a hungry student to learn. We are able to take advantage of federal funding to offer these meals to our students at no cost. We are only reimbursed for those students who actually eat these meals, so we have continued to look for ways to increase participation. This year we have experimented with delivering breakfast to elementary classrooms. We appreciate you encouraging your children to eat breakfast and lunch here at school (even if they eat at home as well). The higher our participation rate, the greater the funding we are provided, and the greater the chance we can continue offering free

breakfast and lunch in the future.

One more item I wanted to remind you of is the School Messenger phone number to deliver school and district information as well as school closings and delay information. The number is 844-875-6020. You may want to save that number in your phone's contacts so you will recognize it when we call late at night or early in the morning with a school closing or delay. One of the benefits of this number is if you miss a call, you are able to call the number back and it will replay recent messages you received from the district. As many of you know, we already had to use this system this school year to cancel elementary school right before the school day began due to lack of water pressure. I really appreciate the quick response from our parents and guardians in picking up the children who had already arrived at school. I apologize for any inconvenience this may have caused.

As I begin my sixth year in the district, I continue to be impressed with the amount of community pride shown by our students, staff, and community members at our school and sport events. As usual, our Open House and Meet the Team activities were well attended by the community and I have seen many of you at one of our fall athletic events. I encourage you to attend one of our upcoming events as well. We all must work together to provide the best education possible for our students.

### K-8 Middle School


## Asst. Principal, Scott Houk

Our staff was trained to use the PAX system to improve behavior, develop self- discipline in students, grow positive relationships between students, and strengthen time on task in classrooms. Your child may talk with you about things such as PAX quiet, PAX Hands, and Granny's Wacky Prizes. He or she may bring home a positive Tootles note written by either a teacher or another student. You may also hear about their teacher using a harmonica in class. These are all part of PAX. We have already witnessed better relationships being built amongst students as well as quieter hallways and smoother transitions. If you have any questions about PAX in your child's classroom please contact their teacher.

As the weather changes it is important that you check the weather each day to ensure your child is dressed appropriately for outside recess. Children will be going outside in the mornings when it is cool. Please dress them appropriately.

It has been an outstanding beginning to the school year. Thank you for all your help and for allowing us to work with your children. If you have any questions or concerns, please do not hesitate to contact us. We are here

to do what is best for your child.
