### A Note from the Superintendent

Dear Ceramics,

The first half of the school year is complete and our winter sports seasons are well underway. We have been fairly fortunate with the weather so far this year, but I encourage you to watch your phones, local media, and our district Facebook and Twitter to see school closings and delays due to the weather. Typically, the third nine weeks is the quarter most effected by weather. I want to remind you about our plan to make-up calamity days. We will not be required to make-up the first five days we miss. If we have missed six days by February 17<sup>th</sup>, then this day will serve as a make-up day. If the sixth calamity day occurs after February 17<sup>th</sup> or we have used seven calamity days before March 13<sup>th</sup>, then March 13<sup>th</sup> will serve as a make-up day as well. After February 17<sup>th</sup> and March 13<sup>th</sup> make-up dates are scheduled to be used, the next three calamity days will be made up via Blizzard Bags. Students will not be required to make-up any additional calamity days unless the number of instructional hours fall below the state minimum requirements. As always, I continue to take the safety of our students very seriously and will close or delay school if it is unsafe for our students to travel. I will continue to notify the major media outlets and our social media platforms of any closings or delays and will also attempt to contact parents through our School Messenger phone system. Our School Messenger phone number is 844-875-6020. I encourage you to save that number in your contacts. Also, when you call the number back, you are able to hear previous messages if you happen to miss our call.

We were very blessed to have a local organization donate bicycles to some of our students this holiday season. Our district offers a big thank you to Bike Buckeye Lake for providing ten bikes, helmets, and locks.

This newsletter will provide you with some of the highlights from the first half of our very successful academic year. I invite you to attend one of our many upcoming sporting or academic events that take place within our schools. I truly appreciate all of the support our community shows for our students. # **Crooksville iLearn News Joy Wolfel, Program Coordinator**

The Crooksville iLearn program offers before and after school programming for our students in grades K-12. The before school program is open for students in grades K-4 while the after school program services all of our students. Our primary focus is to provide academic support for reading and math, but students also have the opportunity to attend homework help, study table and clubs.

Our elementary iLearn students have been working hard this year participating in homework help, receiving intervention and enrichment activities, participating in clubs, and project based learning. New clubs were introduced after returning from break. The fall clubs included science, nature, scrapbooking, and board games; students participated in these clubs two days a week. Elementary iLearn participated in three family events with our community partner, Perry County District Library. The activities were based around Harmony the Llama, The Lion King, Frozen, and Pizza with Santa.

The football team joined our Middle School iLearn program for study table in the fall. During this time, the students had the opportunity to complete their homework, study for upcoming assessments, and complete any missing assignments with their coach, Ron Childress. Eighth grade students have the opportunity to earn \$125 towards their trip to Washington by attending the iLearn program. We are excited to support over thirty 8<sup>th</sup> graders who have taken advantage of this opportunity. Our middle school students also participated in "Miracle on Main Street." They created cards, ornaments, and homemade cookies and delivered these items to local businesses on Main Street in Crooksville. This was a unique way for our students to interact with our community.

Our High School students visited Cherry Orchards where they enjoyed sampling a variety of apples, learned what it takes to run an apple orchard, and got to bring apples home with them. We started a new Thanksgiving tradition this year that allowed students to create their own Thanksgiving meal. Students decided what they wanted to eat, created a shopping list, cooked the food, learned about portion control, and prepared the table. They finished the meal by sharing what they were thankful for. The drivers education program has returned for a second year. A mandatory parent meeting is scheduled for January 22<sup>nd</sup> at 5:00 pm in the K8 library. The program begins on January 27<sup>th</sup>. Indoor track has been busy practicing and participating in track meets around the state of Ohio. Drama Club will begin practice soon for their spring play with the assistance of iLearn. We are excited to introduce ESports as a new CHS afterschool club. More information about joining the team and the upcoming schedule of events will be sent home soon. On February 13<sup>th</sup> a partnership with COAD and iLearn will be offering Systematic Training for Effective Parenting to families of students ages 6-12. Parents/Guardians will learn how to build self-esteem, discipline effectively, and deal with common parent concerns. This will be held in the K8 library, babysitting will be provided at no cost, and gas cards are available to defray travel cost. 
