#### **Declaration of Independence**

The main purpose of America's Declaration of Independence was to explain to foreign nations why the colonies had chosen to separate themselves from Great Britain. The Revolutionary War had already begun, and several major battles had already taken place. The American colonies had already cut most major ties to England, and had established their own congress, currency, army, and post office. On June 7, 1776, at Independence Hall in Philadelphia, Richard Henry Lee voiced a resolution that the United States ought to be completely free of England's influence, and that all political ties between the two countries should be dissolved. Congress agreed and began plans to publish a formal declaration of independence and appointed a committee of five members to draft the declaration.

Thomas Jefferson was chosen to draft the letter - which he did in a single day. Four other members, Roger Sherman, Robert Livingston, Benjamin Franklin and John Adams were part of the committee to help Jefferson. In the Declaration of Independence, Jefferson explained that a body of people has a right to change governments if that government becomes oppressive (unfair and controlling). He further explained that governments fail when they no longer have the consent of the governed. Since Parliament clearly lacked the consent of the American colonists to govern them, it was no longer legitimate.

The Declaration was presented to the Continental Congress in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania on July 2, 1776. It was approved with a few minor changes. Of the 56 signers of the Declaration of Independence, John Hancock, of Massachusetts was the first.

# Egypt's Extraordinary Female Pharaoh

#### Quest to Be Pharaoh

Hatshepsut did not acquire power easily. Her father arranged for Hatshepsut to be married to Thutmose II. The two of them ruled together after her father's death. After the death of her husband, Thutmose II, Hatshepsut lost her power. Thutmose III became the pharaoh. Because he was too young to rule, Hatshepsut ruled as his regent.


Hatshepsut always felt, however, that she deserved to be the real pharaoh. She decided to prove she was worthy of the title by claiming to be divine. She believed her father was the Egyptian god, Amon, who took the form of Thutmose I. She also claimed that because she was her father's favorite child, she deserved to be his heir.

#### **Hatshepsut Declared Pharach**

Hatshepsut resented having to rule on behalf of Thutmose III. In about 1479 B.C., Hatshepsut declared herself to be the real pharaoh. In order to play the part of the pharaoh, Hatshepsut decided to act like a man. She wore the traditional royal clothing of a pharaoh. She even went so far as to wear a fake beard! She declared herself to be "King of Upper and Lower Egypt." Hatshepsut ordered a great temple to be built in her honor. Two enormous granite pillars, called obelisks, were placed at the entrance to the temple. Stonecutters carved words of praise to Hatshepsut.

#### Hatshepsut's Rule

Hatshepsut proved to be a very successful leader. She had old temples that had been damaged in battles restored. Hatshepsut sent a trade expedition to Punt to bring back gold, ivory, leopard skins, ostrich feathers, and other precious items for Egypt. She sent workers back into the desert to mine for rich ores. Her greatest success, however, was the 20 years of peace Egypt enjoyed.



Each obelisk was 97 feet (30 m) tall.

#### **End of an Era**

Hatshepsut's rule was under constant threat of revolt. As Thutmose III grew older, he resented her claim to the throne. Hatshepsut mysteriously disappeared. After her disappearance, Thutmose III declared himself to be the rightful pharaoh. He destroyed all images and references to Hatshepsut. Although there is no solid proof, legend has it that Thutmose III murdered Hatshepsut to regain the throne.
