Reading and Language Arts Phonics - Suffixes -less and -ness Comprehension: cause and effect

Don't forget to do your lessons on Reading Eggs and Reading Eggspress! Once you get to lesson 61 on Reading Eggspress, it's third grade level! Get moving! Go outside and play! Ride bikes, play outdoor games, jump on a trampoline. If you're stuck inside, play "the floor is lava," they love that! If you're stuck inside, put up a Just Dance video on YouTube or go to www.GoNoodle.com and set up a family account.
