Re: Calamity Days

Dear Crooksville Families,

This letter is to inform you of a change to calamity days for this school year. As you are well aware, the district has made a large investment and commitment to the utilization of our remote learning capabilities. Each student has their own Ipad and we have been fortunate to be able to provide mobile internet for families that did not previously have service. This has been influential in the district's ability to provide instruction remotely on designated Wednesdays.

As we approach winter weather, and the possibility of having to use calamity days, we will proceed with our utilization and practice that has taken place on remote Wednesdays. Students will not have any obligations or requirements for the first **FIVE** calamity days. If and when Crooksville Schools reaches six or more days, students will be required to complete assignments from their teachers. This will vary between buildings, grades and even classes. Teachers will be in communication with parents and students as to what their assignments will look like and clarify expectations. This change ensures that school **WILL NOT** be in session on February 15 (Presidents' Day) or March 19. Also, this guarantees the last day of school to be Wednesday, May 26.
